Approach

ing the Piano Accompa niment

Work on the left-hand rhythm pattern until it becomes automatic. The syncopation must be rock-solid before you add the melody or the vocalist.

2. **Pedal**

Technique: Use the sustain pedal judiciously. The harmony

changes frequently, and over-pedaling will create a muddy, indistinct sound. A half-pedal or flutter pedal technique can help connect phrases without blurring the harmony.
