EXAMPLE 1: EASY ADDITION PUZZLE

Grid size: 3x3 (all cells active)



Clues:

- Across 1: 3 + 4
- Across 4: 6 + 2
- Across 7: 5 + 5
- Down 1: 2 + 5
- Down 2: 4 + 4
- Down 3: 3 + 3

Answers: Across 1: 7, Across 4: 8, Across 7: 10, Down 1: 7, Down 2: 8, Down 3: 6. Notice that Down 1 and Across 1 share a starting cell, so that cell must contain both the first digit of Across 7 and the first digit of Down 7? Actually, careful: In a 3x3 grid, cells are numbered as in a standard crossword. For simplicity, let's assume cell (1,1) is Across 1 (3 digits?) - actually $3+4=7$ is a single digit? Typically answers are multi-digit; but to keep simple, assume single-digit answers. This example illustrates that you must check both directions. For a real puzzle, answers are usually numbers with at least two digits. Let's move on to a more realistic example.

EXAMPLE 2: TWO-DIGIT PUZZLE

Clues:

- Across 1: 12 + 5 (two digits)
- Across 3: 7×3 (two digits)
- Down 1: 4×4 (two digits)
- Down 2: 20 - 8 (two digits)

Solution grid: Assume a 2x2 grid? Actually, we need a minimal grid. Let's say across entries are two cells each, and down entries also two cells. The grid has four cells arranged in a square. Cell (1,1) is first digit of Across 1 and Down 1. Cell (1,2) is second digit of Across 1 and first digit of Down 2. Cell (2,1) is first digit of Across 3 and second digit of Down 1. Cell (2,2) is second digit of Across 3 and second digit of Down 2.

Answers: Across 1: 17 (digits 1 and 7), Across 3: 21 (digits 2 and 1), Down 1: 16 (digits 1 and 6), Down 2: 12 (digits 1 and 2). Does it fit? Check: Cell (1,1)=1 (Across1 first digit, Down1 first digit - both 1, ok). Cell (1,2)=7 (Across1 second digit, Down2 first digit - Down2 first digit should be 1, not 7. So conflict! That means our assumption about grid layout is wrong. This shows the crucial importance of grid design. In a proper math crossword, the clues must be consistent.
